Chamber Singers is a small ensemble of selected voices which was organized during the fall of 1968. Like chamber instrumental groups, this ensemble specializes in literature composed for one performer on a part. Their repertoire includes Renaissance madrigals, chansons, part-songs and opera ensembles as well as 20th century works for solo voices. Performances are enhanced by the use of authentic accompanying instruments such as harpsichord, hand drums, and portative organ.

THE UNIVERSITY

The University of West Florida was established in 1963 as a unit in the State University System of Florida and opened its doors to students in September, 1967. Founded as an upper division university beginning at the junior level, it plans eventually to offer graduate work in certain disciplines programs.

Located on a 1,000-acre, tree-shaded campus 10 miles north of Pensacola, the campus presently has a \$17 million dollar plant. A five-story library with 250,000 volumes, air-conditioned residence houses, science complex, instructional service facilities and a humanities complex are typical of the modern structures erected. An auxiliary campus on nearby Santa Rosa Island with frontage on Pensacola Bay and the Gulf of Mexico provides facilities for recreation and studies in marine biology.

THE FACULTY OF MUSIC

The University of West Florida believes that superior musician/teachers are developed through a thorough knowledge of music history, literature, theory, and performance as well as teaching methods. The Faculty of Music has inaugurated a rigorous program involving these phases of music as a core for all music majors at the University. This Faculty presently is comprised of five members, all of whom have been chosen for performance abilities as well as academic achievement. The professional experience of these men is available to music students who choose to study symphonic repertoire, choral techniques, church music, or interpretation of piano literature.
